- All hospitals shall report to the department all persons diagnosed as having Alzheimer's Disease, multiple sclerosis and Parkinson's Syndrome no later than 30 days from the date of diagnosis or from discharge from a hospital.
  - A physician, upon notification by the department, shall report to the department any further information requested by the department concerning any person now or formerly under his care diagnosed as having or having had one of these neurological disorders.
- No physician or hospital complying with the reporting requirements of this section may be liable for any civil damages as a result of those acts.

 This bill establishes a statewide reporting system for Alzheimer's Disease, multiple sclerosis and Parkinson's Syndrome. This reporting system will provide data on how serious a problem these disorders are in this State and will allow the Department of Human Services to gather statistical data to ascertain factors unique to this State, if any, which may contribute to the occurrence of these disorders.

Many in the health community are unaware of how to deal with these neurological disorders. This bill requires the department to disseminate information regarding treatment of these disorders to the health community.

This bill will also maintain a list of individuals suffering from these disorders to facilitate their efforts to contact others and to participate in support groups which they might otherwise be unaware of.
