| §1681. Definitions  |

This notification may be verbal or may be by a sign prominently displayed at or near the entrance. The restaurant shall encourage their patrons to make their seating requests known. |

| 14<br>15<br>16<br>17<br>18 | This new draft replaces the original bill. It deletes retail food stores and requires restaurants to notify their patrons of their seating policy, either verbally or by a sign. It does not require a restaurant to designate a nonsmoking section.   |
