22 23	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37	Sec. 1. Relocation commission established. There is established the Supreme Judicial Court Relocation Commission. The commission shall consist of 9 members to be appointed as follows: Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary and one a member of the Joint Standing Committee on State Government; 3 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, one a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary, one a member of the Joint Standing Committee on State Government and one a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs; 2 members appointed by the Chief Jus-

- tice of the Supreme Judicial Court; and 2 members of the public appointed by the Governor.
- The commission shall request the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court or his designee to serve as advisor to the commission.
- 6 Sec. 2. Duties of commission. The commission
 7 shall investigate any possible consolidation of ex8 isting functions and personnel of the Supreme Judi9 cial Court and the disposition and acquisition of
 10 court facilities.
- Sec. 3. Report. The commission shall report its findings together with any implementing legislation to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature.
- Sec. 4. Assistance. The Office of Legislative
 Assistants and the Legislative Finance Office shall
 provide assistance to the commission in carrying out
 its duties. The commission shall request from the
 Judicial Department any assistance it needs from that
 department.
- Sec. 5. Compensation. The members of the commission shall receive no compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all necessary expenses.
- Sec. 6. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This new draft establishes a relocation commission to investigate the relocation and report to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature.

The purpose of this new draft is to delete the sections of the original bill that required the Supreme Judicial Court be moved to Augusta. The new draft instead requires only that a study commission investigate the possibility of moving the court.

The new draft also provides that members of the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary, the Joint Standing Committee on State Government and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs will serve on the study commission.

The new draft changes the time the commission must report its findings from the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature to the First Regular Session of the 113th Legislature.

The new draft provides for staffing assistance.

Because of the changed reporting date and because the original appropriation section did not reflect the actual costs of payment of expenses and printing associated with the study commission the appropriation section of the bill is changed to reflect the true costs of such a study. The appropriation assumes 6 meetings of the study commission, 2 of which may be public hearings.

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
