19 20 21	AN ACT to Provide for Public Rest Rooms in Eating Establishments.
22 23	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
24	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA c. 270-A is enacted to read:
25	CHAPTER 270-A
26	PUBLIC REST ROOM FACILITIES IN EATING PLACES
27	§1681. Definitions
28 29 30	As used in this chapter, unless the context oth- erwise indicates, the following terms have the fol- lowing meanings.
31 32	1. Eating establishment. "Eating establishment" means an eating establishment licensed by the Depart-

ment of Human Services under chapter 562 which pre-1 2 pares and serves food to the public for consumption inside the premises. "Eating establishment" does not 3 4 include catering establishments, establishments dis-5 pensing food solely from vending machines, pushcarts and mobile eating places, roadside stands, retail 6 7 frozen dairy product establishments or any other such 8 places where customers do not consume food inside the 9 building where the food is prepared and served.

10 §1682. Rest room facilities required

11 <u>An eating establishment shall provide at least</u> 12 <u>one toilet facility for the use of its customers. The</u> 13 <u>toilets provided shall be clearly marked, maintained</u> 14 <u>in a sanitary condition and in good repair. There</u> 15 <u>shall be no charge for their use. Lavatory facilities</u> 16 <u>shall be located within or immediately adjacent to</u> 17 <u>all toilet rooms or vestibules.</u>

18 §1683. Rules

19The Department of Human Services may adopt, in20accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure21Act, Title 5, chapter 375, rules to administer this22chapter and thereby protect the public health.

23 §1684. Enforcement

This chapter shall be enforced by the Division of Health Engineering. Anyone violating this chapter or rules under this chapter commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than \$200 may be adjudged. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense.

30 Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act shall take ef-31 fect on January 1, 1987.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This new draft requires eating establishments to 3 provide at least one toilet facility for the use of 4 its customers. An eating establishment is a facility 5 licensed by the Department of Human Services to serve 6 food for consumption inside the premises and does not 7 include establishments which are licensed by the De-8 partment of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources to 9 serve food as a minor part of a retail sales business 10 or establishments such as pushcarts or roadside stands where customers do not consume food inside the 11 12 building where it is prepared and served.

13 The Department of Human Services is given power 14 to adopt rules to ensure privacy, cleanliness and 15 general compliance with this new draft.

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
