SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A"
to S.P. 547, L.D. 1460, Bill, "AN ACT to Authorize a
Self-liquidating Bond Issue for the County of Cumber-
land to Raise Funds for the Construction of a Court-
house Addition, Capital Improvements to the Existing
Structure and a Related Parking Facility."

Amend the amendment by striking out all of the
first 2 paragraphs after the title (page 1, lines 13
to 18 in amendment) and inserting in their place the
following:

'Amend the bill in the title in the 4th line
(page 1, line 20 in L.D.) by striking out the word
and punctuation "Addition," and inserting in their
place the words 'Addition and' and in the last line
(page 1, line 21 in L.D.) by striking out the words
"and a Related Parking Facility"

Further amend the bill by striking out all of
section 1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. To raise money for courthouse construc-
tion and capital improvements. The county commis-
sioners of Cumberland County are authorized to raise
and expend by issuing bonds or notes, a sum not to
exceed \$4,000,000 for courthouse construction and
courthouse capital improvements.'

Further amend the bill in section 2, in the 2nd
line, (page 1, line 34 in L.D.) by inserting after
the words "construction and" the word 'courthouse'

Further amend the bill in section 2, in the 2nd,
3rd and 4th lines (page 1, lines 34, 35 and 36 in
L.D.) by striking out the words "and such related
parking or other facilities as the county commission-
