AN ACT to Create a Commission to Study the Availability and Coordination of Resources and Training for Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention and Treatment in Maine.
Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
Whereas, there has been a dramatic increase in the number of reported cases of child abuse and neglect; and
Whereas, that increase has strained the legal, administrative and human resources of this State; and
Whereas, the response to that increase will result in administrative and legal action which will further burden the existing resources for child abuse and neglect; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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- 9 Sec. 1. Commission, duties. The Child Abuse and 10 Neglect Resource Development Commission shall be con-11 and appointed to study the need for child stituted 12 abuse and neglect resources and to develop a plan to 13 provide adequate resources and a process to implement 14 that plan. The commission shall investigate and eval-15 uate the current resources available to individuals 16 and agencies and organizations in the State which with the problems associated with child abuse 17 18 and neglect. The study shall include, but need not be 19 limited to:
 - Training. Current training and training materials available to mandated reporters of child and neglect, including, but not limited to, governmental, quasi-governmental, community and private professional agencies and others, both nonprofessional, involved in child abuse and neglect, including judicial, law enforcement and educational agencies. This shall include in-house institution-free training;
 - Consultation. Consultative services available for individuals and agencies involved in child abuse and neglect;
 - 3. Library resources. Library and other educational or service-oriented resources, including the quantity, quality and availability of those resources; and
 - 4. Services. Other services or resources available to agencies or individuals or which should be available, including the availability of scholarships for the study of child abuse and neglect or for child abuse and neglect training.

The report shall evaluate the need for and the adequacy and availability of the resources available for the prevention and treatment of child abuse and neglect and for intervention in child abuse and neglect situations. The report shall present a plan for a comprehensive and coordinated resource development program for the State.

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- Sec. 2. Membership. The commission shall be composed of 9 members as follows: Three members of Legislature, 2 of whom shall be from the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and one from the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, one appointed by the President of the Senate and 2 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; the Commissioner of Corrections, or his designee; the Commissioner of Educational Cultural Services, or his designee; the Commissioner of Human Resources, or his designee; the Commissioner of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, or his a district attorney, appointed by the Goverignee; nor; and a member of the Board of Trustees of University of Maine, or his designee, appointed by the board. In addition, the Chief Justice of the preme Judicial Court is encouraged to appoint 2 justices or judges to act as consultants to the commission. The members shall be appointed in a timely manner and the commission shall hold an organizational meeting at the call of the chairman of the Legislative Council within 60 days after the effective date of this Act. At this meeting, the commission shall elect a chairman and a vice-chairman.
- Sec. 3. Reports. The commission shall present its findings, together with any recommended legislation or administrative recommendations, to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature by November 1, 1985.
- 37 Sec. 4. Assistance. The Legislative Council 38 shall provide for staff assistance to the commission 39 in carrying out its duties.
 - Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill provides for a commission to assess the
current resources, including training, consultative,
library and other resources, available to people who
must deal with the problems of child abuse and ne-
glect. The commission will propose a comprehensive,
coordinated program to develop adequate resources in
this area.

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
