23	DIETITIANS
24	§9901. Declaration of purpose
25 26 27 28 29 30 31	In order to recognize the professional qualifications of dietitians and dietetic technicians and to assure the availability to the public of information regarding those who hold themselves out to be dietitians and dietetic technicians, it is the purpose of this chapter to provide for the registration of qualified dietitians and dietetic technicians.

- As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following terms have the 2 3 lowing meanings.
- 4 Board. "Board" means the Board of Registra-5 tion of Dietetic Practice established under this 6 chapter.
- 2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Business, Occupational and Professional 7 8 9 Regulation.
- Department. "Department" means the Depart-10 ment of Business, Occupational and Professional Regu-11 12 lation.
- 13 4. Dietetics. "Dietetics" means the profession-14 al discipline of assessing the nutritional needs of an individual, including recognition of the effects 15 of the individual's physical condition and economic 16 17 circumstances, and the applying of scientific principles of nutrition to prescribing means to ensure the 18 19 individual's proper nourishment and care.
- 20 Registered dietetic technician. "Registered dietetic technician" means a person registered under 21 this chapter who practices dietetics under the super-22 23 vision of a dietitian who is registered in accordance 24 with this chapter.
- 6. Registered dietitian. "Registered dietitian" means a person who practices dietetics and who is 25 26 27 registered as a dietitian under this chapter.
- 28 Board of Registration of Dietetic Practice; 29 establishment; compensation
- 30 Establishment and membership. There is established, within the Department of Business, Occupational and Professional Regulation, the Board of Reg-31 32 istration of Dietetic Practice. The board shall consist of 5 members appointed by the Governor, includ-33
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- ing 2 public members who are residents of this State, who do not hold registration to practice dietetics 2 3 and who have no direct or indirect financial interest in the practice or delivery of dietetic services. 4 5 Other than these public members, the persons ap-6 pointed to the board shall have been engaged in rendering dietetic services to the public or in teaching or research in dietetics for at least 2 years immediately preceding their appointments. Two board mem-7 8 9 bers shall be dietitians. The 5th member shall be 10 either a dietitian or a dietetic technician. The professional members shall at all times be holders of 11 12 13 valid registrations under this chapter, except for 14 the members of the first board, each of whom shall 15 fulfill the requirements for registration under this 16 chapter.
  - 2. Terms of appointment. To the first board established under this chapter, the Governor shall appoint 2 board members for terms of one year, 2 for terms of 2 years and one for a term of 3 years. Appointments made thereafter shall be for 3-year terms, but no person may be appointed to serve more than 3 consecutive terms, provided that for this purpose only, a period actually served which exceeds 1/2 of a 3-year term shall be deemed a full term. Any member of the board may be removed from office for cause by the Governor.
- 3. Meetings. The board shall meet at least once
  a year to conduct its business and to elect a chairperson. Additional meetings shall be held as necessary to conduct the business of the board and may be
  covened at the call of the chairperson or a majority
  of the board members. A majority of the members of
  the board shall constitute a quorum for all purposes.
- 4. Compensation. Members of the board shall be
   compensated as provided in Title 5, section 12002-A.
- §9904. Board of Registration of Dietetic Practice;
   powers and duties

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- 1 1. Powers. The board shall administer and enforce this chapter and evaluate the qualifications of applicants for registration. The board may examine witnesses, administer oaths and shall investigate or cause to be investigated any complaints made to it or any cases of noncompliance with or violation of this chapter.
- 8 2. Rules. The board may adopt, in accordance
  9 with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5,
  10 chapter 375, rules relating to professional conduct
  11 to carry out the policy of this chapter, including,
  12 but not limited to, rules relating to professional
  13 registration and to the establishment of ethical
  14 standards of practice for persons registered to practice dietetics in this State.
- 16 3. Hearings. Hearings may be conducted by the 17 board to assist with investigations, to determine 18 whether grounds exist for suspension, revocation or denial of a registration or as otherwise deemed nec-19 20 essary to the fulfillment of its responsibilities un-21 der this chapter. Hearings shall be conducted in ac-22 cordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, 23 Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter IV, to the extent 24 applicable.
- 4. Records. The board shall keep such records and minutes as are necessary to the ordinary dispatch of its functions.
- 28 5. Contracts. The board may enter into con-29 tracts to carry out its responsibilities under this 30 chapter.
- 31 6. Reports. No later than August 1st of each
  32 year, the board shall submit to the commissioner, for
  33 the preceding fiscal year, its annual report of its
  34 operations together with such comments and recommen35 dations as the commissioner deems essential.

- Board of Registration of Dietetic Practice; 2 administrative provisions
- 3 Employees. With the advice of the board, the 4 commissioner may appoint, subject to the Personnel 5 Law, such employees as may be necessary to carry out
- 6 this chapter. Any person so employed shall be located in the department and under the administrative and supervisory direction of the commissioner. 7
- 8
- Budget. The board shall submit to the com-9 10 missioner its budgetary requirements in the same manner as provided in Title 5, section 1665. 11
- 12 §9906. Registration
- Registration required. No person may hold 13 himself out to be a registered dietitian or a regis-14 15 tered dietetic technician or use related terms or words, unless he is registered in accordance with 16 17 this chapter.
- 18 Individual registration. Only an individual 19 may be registered under this chapter.
- 3. Penalty; injunction. A person who violates this section is guilty of a Class E crime. 20 21
- 22 State may bring an action in Superior Court to 23 enjoin any person from violating this chapter, regardless of whether proceedings have been or may be 24 25 instituted in the Administrative Court or whether
- 26 criminal proceedings have been or may be instituted.
- 27 §9907. Requirements for registration; education; ex-28 perience
- 1. Dietitian's registration. An applicant for registration as a dietitian shall file a written application on forms provided by the board, showing to 29 30 31 32 the satisfaction of the board that he meets the fol-33 lowing requirements.

- Annual renewal. Registration shall expire 10 11 annually on December 31st or on such other date as 12 the commissioner may determine. Notice of expiration 13 shall be mailed to each registrant's last known address at least 30 days in advance of the expiration 14 of his registration. The notice shall include any 15 requests for information necessary for renewal. 16
- 17 Registrations may be renewed up to 90 days after the date of expiration upon payment of a late fee of \$10 18 in addition to the renewal fee. Any person who submits an application for renewal more than 90 days af-19 20 21 ter the registration renewal date shall be subject to
- 22 all requirements governing new applicants under this

- 24 Continuing education. Each registration re-25 newal shall be accompanied by evidence of continuing 26 education or other requirements as established in

- 29 Complaints. The board may order an investigation of a complaint on its own motion or on written complaint filed with it regarding noncompliance with 30 31
- or violation of any section of this chapter or of any 32
