COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 572, L.D. 1507, Bill, "AN ACT to Ensure Adequate Services for Head Injured Persons in Maine."

Amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "§3073."

Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 4 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 4. Report. The department shall submit a report to the Legislature, no later than January 15, 1986, describing its progress in developing and implementing the comprehensive rehabilitation service system for head injured persons pursuant to Title 22, section 3072. The report shall include, but not be limited to, a review and evaluation of the resources necessary for an adequate service system and the availability of those resources, including a priority listing of any unavailable resources that are necessary to provide that service.

Sec. 5. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 572, L.D. 1507

1 This amendment deletes the provisions which es-
2 tablish a Head Injury Rehabilitation Service Fund
3 which would have been funded by an increase in the
4 driver's license fee. It provides an appropriation
5 of \$200,000 each year from the General Fund to be
6 used to implement this service system, within the
7 limits of the available resources. It also permits
8 the Bureau of Rehabilitation to accept gifts to as-
9 sist in carrying out its responsibilities under the
10 Independent Living Service for Severely Disabled Per-
11 sons law.

12 This amendment also requires the Department of
13 Human Services to report to the Legislature on the
14 implementation of this bill by January 15, 1986.
