25 Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis-  
26 lature do not become effective until 90 days after  
27 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

28 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate un-  
29 til after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

30 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses inci-  
31 dent to the operation of the department will become  
32 due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1985;  
33 and

34 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature,  
35 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of

1 the Constitution of Maine and require the following  
2 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-  
3 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now,  
4 therefore,

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as  
6 follows:

7       Sec. 1. Allocation of Maine Hazardous Waste  
8 Fund. Income to the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for  
9 the next fiscal year, from July 1, 1985, to June 30,  
10 1986, shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed  
11 as designated in the following schedule:

22       Sec. 2. Allocation of Low-level Waste Siting  
23 Fund. Income to the Low-level Waste Siting Fund for  
24 the fiscal year from July 1, 1985, to June 30, 1986,  
25 shall be segregated, apportioned and disbursed as

2 Sec. 3. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations  
3 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Of-  
4 ficer with the approval of the Governor to specifi-  
5 cally cover those adjustments determined to be neces-  
6 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legisla-  
7 ture and those reclassifications or range changes  
8 which have been approved by the Department of Person-  
9 nel and submitted for legislative review prior to the  
10 effective date of this Act.

11 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited  
12 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1,  
13 1985.

14 STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The purpose of this new draft is to make alloca-  
16 tions from the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund for the  
17 fiscal year ending June 30, 1986, and to make alloca-  
18 tions from the Low-level Waste Siting Fund for the  
19 fiscal year ending June 30, 1986.
