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AN ACT Concerning Nomination Petitions for  
Unenrolled Candidates.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

21-A MRSA §354, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

2. By whom signed. A nomination petition may be signed only by unenrolled voters of the electoral division which is to make the nomination, except that nomination petitions for presidential electors may be signed by any unenrolled Maine voter. Other signatures are void.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this new draft is to require that nomination petitions for unenrolled candidates and presidential electors for unenrolled candidates be signed only by persons who are not enrolled in any established political party.

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
