18	AN ACT to Establish Legislative Council
19	Oversight of Expenditures for Joint Standing
20	Committees, Joint Select Committees and
21 22	Legislative Investigating Committees.
23 24	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
25	Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §165, sub-§9 is enacted to read:
26	9. Oversight of expenditures. Itemized budget
27	estimates shall be presented to the Legislative Coun-
28	cil for approval before the committee proceeds with
29 30	its authorized work. Budgets must contain, but not be limited to, the following categories:
31	A. Personnel. The committee shall justify to
32	the Legislative Council the need for full-time or
33	part-time staff beyond the resources available
34	through the nonpartisan legislative staff agen-
35	cies and in specific relation to the authorized

1	scope of work. The Legislative Council shall
2	specifically authorize the level of staffing ef-
3	fort and type of staffing arrangements including,
4	but not limited to:
5	(1) Secretarial staff;
6	(2) Contractual staff; and
7	(3) Technical and professional consultants;
8	B. Salary and benefits. The Legislative Council
9	shall adopt general policies regarding compensa-
10	tion of staff hired specifically for joint select
11	and special committees including, but not limited
12	to:
13 14	(1) Clerical and research staff. Existing legislative salary scales shall be used; and
15	(2) Special, technical or professional con-
16	sultation. The Legislative Council shall
17	establish a ceiling for a daily rate or for
18	total fees to be paid to a particular firm.
19	Ceilings shall be renegotiated only with
20	prior Legislative Council authorization.
21	All proposed salaries and fees shall be reviewed
22	by the Legislative Council prior to any commit-

27	C. Committee members. The committee shall pro-
28	pose compensation for committee members, includ-
29	ing per diem compensation and compensation for
30	meals and mileage;
31	D. Travel. Staff and consultants hired to work
32	specifically with a joint select committee or
33	joint special committee shall be reimbursed for
34	expenses incurred in the performance of committee
35	work as follows.

1	(1) There shall be no reimbursement for
2	mileage to and from an employee's residence
3	and Augusta.
4	(2) Reimbursement at the rate in effect for
5	all state employees for all in-state travel
6	shall be as authorized by the committee
7	chairmen.
8	(3) Any reimbursement of out-of-state
9	travel expenses on behalf of the committee
10	must be approved in advance by the Legisla-
11	tive Council upon request of the committee
12	chairmen.
13	(4) Any reimbursement of expenses for au-
14	thorized out-of-state travel shall be reim-
15	bursed according to policies governing
16	travel by Legislators.
17	(a) Reimbursement for airplane fares
18	shall be according to the actual fare
19	which shall be for coach class only.
20	(b) Reimbursement for hotel costs
21	shall be according to the actual cost,
22	provided that the government rate shall
23	be requested.
24	(c) Reimbursement for meals shall be
25	according to the actual cost, provided
26	that a maximum of \$26 a day shall be
27	allowed for those meals for which re-
28	ceipts are provided.
29	(d) Reimbursement for taxi, limosine
30	or parking costs shall be according to
31	the actual cost, provided that re-
32	ceipts shall be required for any amount
33	over \$5.
34	(e) Other expenses shall be reimbursed
35	based on actual costs, which shall be
36	based on receipts where available. Al-
37	coholic beverages, HBO, valet and other
38	similar goods or services are specifi-

25	6. Variations in budget. The committee shall
26	request approval from the Legislative Council for any
27	variation in the line budget before incurring any ob-
28	ligations not already approved by the Legislative
29	Council.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to establish a set of guidelines and a method by which the Legislative Council may oversee expenditures for joint standing committees, joint select committees and legislative investigating committees.
