STATE OF MAINE

AN ACT Concerning Snowmobile Registration
Fund Distribution.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

12 MRSA §7824, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

2-A. Servicemen permanently stationed in Maine. The following persons are eligible to register any snowmobile owned by them at the resident fee:

A. Any person serving in the Armed Forces of the United States who is permanently stationed at a military or naval post, station or base in the State; and

B. The spouse and children of that person, provided that the spouse and children permanently reside with that person.

1 Such a member of the Armed Forces desiring to regis-
2 ter a snowmobile shall present certification from the
3 commander of his post, station or base, or from the
4 commander's designated agent, that the person men-
5 tioned in the certificate is permanently stationed at
6 that post, station or base. Registration fees for
7 registrations pursuant to this subsection shall be
8 allocated as if the person registering the snowmobile
9 was a resident of the municipality in which the post,
10 station or base is situated.

11 FISCAL NOTE

12 This bill will result in a loss in revenue to the
13 department of \$1,050 per fiscal year.

14 STATEMENT OF FACT

15 The original bill allows service personnel sta-
16 tioned in Maine to be considered as residents of the
17 community within which they are stationed for the
18 purposes of distributing their snowmobile registra-
19 tion fees and to obtain the registrations at resident
20 rates.

21 This new draft accomplishes the same purpose as
22 the original in a more specific and complete fashion.
23 It includes the spouse and children of the servicemen
24 in the provisions of the law.

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
