15 16 17	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
18 19 20	AN ACT Concerning Snowmobile Registration Fund Distribution.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23	12 MRSA §7824, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
24 25 26	2-A. Servicemen permanently stationed in Maine. The following persons are eligible to register any snowmobile owned by them at the resident fee:
27 28 29 30	A. Any person serving in the Armed Forces of the United States who is permanently stationed at a military or naval post, station or base in the State; and
31 32 33	B. The spouse and children of that person, pro- vided that the spouse and children permanently reside with that person.

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8	Such a member of the Armed Forces desiring to regis- ter a snowmobile shall present certification from the commander of his post, station or base, or from the commander's designated agent, that the person men- tioned in the certificate is permanently stationed at that post, station or base. Registration fees for registrations pursuant to this subsection shall be
	allocated as if the person registering the snowmobile
9 10	was a resident of the municipality in which the post,
10	station or base is situated. FISCAL NOTE
12 13	This bill will result in a loss in revenue to the department of \$1,050 per fiscal year.
14	STATEMENT OF FACT
15 16 17 18 19 20	The original bill allows service personnel sta- tioned in Maine to be considered as residents of the community within which they are stationed for the purposes of distributing their snowmobile registra- tion fees and to obtain the registrations at resident rates.
21 22 23 24	This new draft accomplishes the same purpose as the original in a more specific and complete fashion. It includes the spouse and children of the servicemen in the provisions of the law.
