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STATEMENT OF FACT

12 The purpose of this bill is to place a \$100,000 13 limitation on the amount which can be recovered 14 against a proprietor who serves liquor to a patron 15 where the patron subsequently injures another person. 16 The bill also requires notice of the action within 17 one year of the occurrence.

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
