18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	AN ACT to Provide Greater Discretion to the Governor in Making Appointments to the Maine State Board of Nursing and to Require that this Board Contain at least 2 Representatives with Administrative and Supervisory Experience.
26 27	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
28 29	32 MRSA §2151, as amended by PL 1983, c. 812, §216, is further amended to read:
30	§2151. Appointment; term; removal
31 32 33 34 35	A State Board of Nursing, as established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 1, shall consist of 7 members who shall be appointed by the Governor. Five members of the board shall be professional nurses, one of whom shall be active in practical nurse educa-

1 tion or in a school of practical nursing at the time 2 of appointment. One member shall be a licensed prac-3 tical nurse. One member shall be a representative of 4 the public. Except to fill vacancies in unexpired 5 terms, all appointments shall be for a term of 5 6 years after such appointment or until their succes-7 sors have been duly appointed and qualified. No per-8 son may be eligible for more than one reappointment. 9 Any publie member vacancy on the board shall be 10 filled for the unexpired term by the appointment of 11 another public member by the Governor. Any members 12 of the board may be removed from office for cause by 13 the Governor.

14 Each appointment of a professional nurse shall be 15 made from a list of 3 candidates, qualified as pro-16 vided, and selected by the presidents or designees of 17 Maine nursing organizations with national affiliation 18 and submitted to the Governor by the President of the 19 Maine State Nurses! Association not less than 60 days 20 before the time of appointment-Any professional 21 nurse vacancy occurring on the board shall be filled 22 for the unexpired term by appointment to be made ₽¥ 23 the Governor from like nominations submitted by the 24 President of the Maine State Nurses! Association ±η 25 the manner described in this paragraph-

26 Each appointment of a practical nurse shall be 27 made from a list of 3 candidates, qualified as provided, and selected by the presidents or designees of 28 29 Maine nursing organizations with national affiliation and submitted to the Governor by the President of the Maine Licensed Practical Nurses! Association not less 30 31 32 than 60 days before the time of appointment- Any 33 practical nurse vacancy occurring on the board shall 34 be filled for the unexpired term by appointment to be 35 made by the Governor from like nominations submitted 36 by the President of the Maine Licensed Practical 37 Nurses! Association in the manner set out in this 38 paragraph-

39 The President of the Maine State Nurses! Associa-40 tion shall eall a meeting of the presidents or desig-41 nees not less than 90 days prior to the expiration of 42 the term of each professional nurse and practical 43 nurse member of the board. The Governor may remove any member from the board for cause:
STATEMENT OF FACT
This new draft sets the number of members on the State Board of Nursing at 7, the current number, and amends the appointment process to be the same as that for other occupational licensing boards.
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
