Amend the amendment in section 3, in that part
designated "§13503-A." by inserting after subsection
2 the following:

'2-A. Teachers at private special education fa-
cilities. Notwithstanding other provisions of this
section, teachers employed at private education fa-
cilities, as defined in section 7302, subsection 2,
are eligible for the 2 teacher recognition grants on
the same basis as teachers in qualifying schools.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 Teachers at private special education facilities
3 must be certified like teachers in public schools,
4 and the schools themselves are approved by the same
5 process as public schools. The schools serve public
6 school tuition students and special needs students
7 referred by state agencies. In effect, these schools
8 are an extension of the State's public school system,
9 and their teachers should be eligible for the teacher
10 recognition grants like their public school counter-
11 parts.
