18 19 20	AN ACT to Require Adequate Notice of Tax Lien Foreclosure.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24 25	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §943, as amended by PL 1983, c. 407, §4, is further amended by adding after the 5th paragraph the following:
26 27 28 29	Beginning with taxes that are assessed after April 1, 1985, the notice of impending automatic foreclosure shall be substantially in the following form:

31	NOTICE OF IMPENDING AUTOMATIC FORECLOSURE

1 2 3 4 5	IMPORTANT: DO NOT DISREGARD THIS NOTICE. YOU WILL LOSE YOUR PROPERTY UNLESS YOU PAY YOUR 19 PROPERTY TAXES, INTEREST AND COSTS.
6	TO:
7 8 9 10 11	You are the party named on a tax lien certificate filed on , 19 , and recorded in Book , Page in the County Registry of Deeds. This filing has created a tax lien mortgage on the real estate described therein.
12 13 14 15	On , 19 , the tax lien mortgage will be foreclosed and your right to recover your property by paying the taxes, interest and costs that are owed will expire.
16 17 18	IF THE TAX LIEN FORECLOSES, THE MUNICIPALITY WILL OWN YOUR PROPERTY.
19 20 21	If you cannot pay the property taxes that you owe because of poverty or illness, you may apply to the town for help with some or all of your tax debt.

24	Sec. 2. 36 MRSA §943-A is enacted to read:
25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	Beginning with taxes that are assessed after April 1, 1985, each notice under section 942, 943 and 1281 which is sent by a municipality or the State Tax Assessor to a person against whom taxes have been assessed, shall contain a statement that that person may apply for an abatement of taxes if the person cannot pay the taxes that have been assessed because of poverty or infirmity.

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This new draft provides a form for notice of im-3 pending automatic foreclosure of a property tax lien. 4 The form contains simplified language which must be 5 used by municipalities. The purpose of the simplified 6 form is to ensure that property owners will be given 7 notice of foreclosure in a format which is easier to 8 understand. The new draft also requires municipali-9 ties and the State Tax Assessor to inform taxpayers, 10 all notices sent during the foreclosure process, that they have a right to request an abatement if 11 they are unable to pay their taxes due to poverty or 12 13 infirmity.

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
