21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24	Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA $\S161$, sub- $\S1$, \PA is enacted to read:
25 26 27 28 29	A. Except as provided in subparagraph (1), the registrar shall note the enrollment status of each, voter using none other than the following: "D" for Democrat, "R" for Republican and "U" for unenrolled.
30 31 32 33	(1) The Secretary of State may authorize the use of other symbols to indicate enrollment in other parties formed or forming under chapter 5, subchapter I.
34 35	Sec. 2. 21-A MRSA §164, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

The registrar shall record enrollments by adding the party designation of the voter beside the voter's name on the voting list, using the symbols prescribed by section 161, subsection 1, paragraph A.

Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 1986.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this new draft is to clarify and standardize the enrollment status on voting lists. Currently, there is no requirement to standardize enrollment status and a wide variety of systems are being used. This new draft will correct that situation at a time in the future when it will be convenient to change to a uniform system.
