§59.	Temporary licenses	

If a person holds a valid license issued by an occupational or professional licensing board established in Title 5, section 12004, subsection 1, paragraph A, at the time of his initial enlistment in the United States Armed Forces and the license lapses during the licensee's initial enlistment, that person may obtain a temporary license if he meets all requirements for issuance of that license except examination by payment of a \$5 fee, provided that his application for the temporary license is made not later than 90 days after the date of his discharge. This temporary license shall continue in force until the results of the next licensing examination are available. The terms of this section shall apply notwithstanding any contrary provision contained in the statutes governing these licensing boards.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This new draft provides a temporary license for members of the Armed Forces who let their occupational licenses lapse during their first enlistment. This allows people to work at their trade while preparing to qualify for a new license.
