SENATE AMENDMENT " B" to S.P. 606, L.D. 1600,

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Bill, "AN ACT to Restructure the Duties and Funding

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of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission."

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Amend the bill by striking out everything after

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the enacting clause and inserting in its place the

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following:

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'12 MRSA §683, first ¶, as amended by PL 1983, c.

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812, §75, is further amended to read:

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The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as es-

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tablished by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 5, to

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carry out the purposes stated in section 681, is cre-

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ated within the Department of Conservation, and in

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this chapter called the "commission." The commission

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is charged with implementing this chapter in all of

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the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State.

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The commission shall consist of 7 public members,

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none of whom shall be state employees, who shall be

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appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the

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Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources and to

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confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year

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terms. Among the public members, there shall be 4

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who shall be knowledgeable in at least one of each of

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the following areas: Commerce and industry; fisheries

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and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the po-

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tential appointees to the commission, the Governor

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shall give consideration to persons residing in or

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near the unorganized areas of the State and at least

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one member shall be a resident of a town or

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plantation within the commission's jurisdiction.'

SENATE AMENDMENT " B" to S.P. 606, L.D. 1600

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this amendment is to require that one of the 7 Maine Land Use Regulations Commissioners be a resident of a plantation or town within the commission's jurisdiction.
