18 19 20 21	AN ACT to Restructure the Duties and Funding of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission.
22 23	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
24 25	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §683, first \P , as amended by PL 1983, c. 812, §75, is further amended to read:
26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 5, to carry out the purposes stated in section 681, is created within the Department of Conservation, and in this chapter called the "commission." The commission is charged with implementing this chapter in all of the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. The commission shall consist of 7 public members, none of whom shall be state employees, who shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources and to

confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among the public members, there shall be 4 who shall be knowledgeable in at least one of each of the following areas: Commerce and industry; fisheries and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the potential appointees to the commission, the Governor shall give consideration to persons residing in or near the unorganized areas of the State and at least one member shall be a resident of the area being served by the commission.

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Study. There is created a Joint Select Sec. 2. Committee to Study the Funding of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission. The committee shall be com-11 members as follows: posed of Two members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over energy and natural resources; 2 members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over local and county government; 2 members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over taxation; members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over fisheries and wildlife; one other member of the Legislature; the Director of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission; local government official from a plantation. one Three of the legislative members and the local government official member shall be appointed by the President of the Senate. Six of the legislative members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The committee shall review the method and sources of funding the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission and consider alternatives.

The committee shall submit its report and any legislation necessary to accomplish its recommendations to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature by January 1, 1986.

FISCAL NOTE

If enacted, this legislation will need a General Fund appropriation to the legislative account of \$5,600 in fiscal year 1986. This amount will fund per diem, travel, printing and miscellaneous expenses of the joint select committee.

3	STATEMENT OF FACT
4 5 6 7 8 9	The purpose of this new draft is to require that one of the 7 commissioners of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission reside in the area under the jurisdiction of the commission. The new draft also creates a joint select committee to study the funding of the commission and report to the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.
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
