18 19 20 21 22	AN ACT Authorizing a Bond Issue for Penobscot County to Raise Funds to Renovate or Expand the Penobscot County Jail.
23 24 25 26 27 28	Sec. 1. To raise money for county jail facility renovations or additions. The county commissioners of Penobscot County are authorized to raise and ex- pend, by issuing bonds or notes, a sum not exceeding \$5,100,000 to make renovations or additions to the county jail facilities.
29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37	Sec. 2. Aid from other sources. The county com- missioners of Penobscot County are authorized to bor- row any portion of the sums authorized by this Act from or through any agency or department of the State and of the Federal Government. The county commis- sioners are authorized to receive grants of money and other assistance from or through any agency or de- partment of the State and of the Federal Government for any of the purposes authorized in this Act.

1 Sec. 3. Bonds or notes. To provide funds for 2 renovations or additions to the county jail facili-3 ties, the treasurer of Penobscot County, with the ap-4 proval of the county commissioners, may borrow from 5 time to time upon the full faith and credit of the 6 county such sums, not exceeding in the aggregate 7 \$5,100,000 as may be necessary, and may issue bonds 8 or notes which shall bear on their faces the words 9 "Penobscot County Capital Improvement Bonds Act of 1985." Each authorized issue shall be payable in such 10 11 installments, beginning not more than 2 years annual 12 from the date, as will extinguish each loan in not 13 more than 20 years from its date. The bonds or notes 14 shall be signed by the treasurer of the county and 15 countersigned by the chairman of the county commis-16 sioners. The county may sell such securities at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as 17 18 the county commissioners deem proper, but at not less 19 than par and accrued interest.

20 Sec. 4. Temporary notes. The county treasurer, 21 with the approval of the county commissioners, may 22 issue temporary notes of the county payable in not more than one year from their dates, in anticipation 23 of the issue of serial bonds under this Act and may 24 25 renew the notes, but the time within which these se-26 rial bonds shall become due and payable shall not, by 27 these temporary notes, be extended beyond reason of 28 the term fixed by this Act. Any notes issued in an-29 ticipation of the serial bonds shall be paid from the 30 proceeds.

31 Sec. 5. Bonds authorized but not issued. Anv bonds authorized but not issued, or for 32 which bond 33 anticipation notes have not been issued within 5 34 years of the ratification of this Act, shall be 35 deauthorized and may not be issued, provided that the 36 Legislature may, within 2 years after the expiration 37 of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing 38 any remaining unissued bonds or bond anticipation 39 notes for an additional amount of time not to exceed 40 5 years.

41 Sec. 6. Referendum for ratification. This Act 42 shall be submitted to the legal voters of Penobscot 43 County. The date of submission shall be at the dis-44 cretion of the Penobscot County Board of Commission1 ers, but not later than 24 months after adjournment 2 of the Legislature. Penobscot County Commissioners 3 are authorized to expend such funds as are necessary 4 to implement the referendum.

5 The county commissioners shall cause the prepara-6 tion of the required ballots on which they shall 7 state the subject matter of this Act in the following 8 question:

9 "Shall the issuance of bonds be authorized in an
10 amount not to exceed \$5,100,000 for renovations
11 or additions to the county jail facilities?"

12 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check 13 mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their 14 opinion of the same.

15 This Act shall take effect for all the purposes 16 hereof immediately upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters voting at the election; provided 17 18 that the total number of votes cast for and against 19 the acceptance of this Act equals or exceeds 30% of 20 the total votes for all candidates for Governor cast 21 in the next previous gubernatorial election in that 22 county. If, at any such first election, the total 23 number of votes cast for or against acceptance of 24 this Act is less than 30% of the total votes for all 25 candidates for Governor cast in that county in the next previous gubernatorial election, the county com-26 27 missioners may call not more than one other such spe-28 cial election to be held within the time prescribed 29 above.

30 The result of such elections shall be declared by 31 the Penobscot County Commissioners and due certifi-32 cate filed with the Secretary of State.

33 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to authorize Penobscot County to raise \$5,100,000 through the issuance of bonds to be used for renovations or additions to the county jail facilities.

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
