18 AN ACT to Extend the Boundaries of the Gray
19 Water District to Include the Entire
20 Town.

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
23 follows:

24 P&SL 1929, c. 33, §1 is repealed and the follow-
25 ing enacted in its place:

26 Sec. 1. Territorial limits; corporate name; pur-
27 poses. Subject to section 13 hereof, the Town of
28 Gray and the people therein shall constitute a public
29 municipal corporation under the name of "Gray Water
30 District" for the purpose of supplying the Town of
31 Gray and the inhabitants of the town and the village
32 corporations therein located, with pure water for do-
33 mestic, manufacturing, sanitary and municipal pur-
34 poses.

1 Referendum; effective date. This Act shall be
2 submitted to the legal voters of the Town of Gray at
3 the next regular town meeting following passage of
4 this Act or at a special town meeting to be called
5 and held for the purpose, no sooner than 90 days nor
6 more than 1 year following adjournment of the First
7 Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. Warrants
8 shall be issued for this town meeting in the manner
9 now provided by law for the holding of town meetings,
10 notifying the qualified voters of Gray to meet to
11 vote on the approval or rejection of this Act.

12 The town clerk shall prepare the required bal-
13 lots, on which he shall reduce the subject matter of
14 this Act to the following question:

15 "Shall the boundaries of the Gray Water District
16 be extended to include the entire town?"

17 The voters shall indicate by a cross or check
18 mark placed against the words "Yes" or "No" their
19 opinion of the question.

20 The results of the vote shall be declared by the
21 municipal officers of that town and due certificate
22 thereof shall be filed by the town clerk with the
23 Secretary of State.

24 This Act shall be deemed approved by the Town of
25 Gray upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal
26 voters of that town voting at that election, provided
27 that the total number of votes cast for and against
28 the acceptance of this Act in that town at that elec-
29 tion equals or exceeds 20% of the total vote for all
30 candidates for Governor in that town at the next pre-
31 vious gubernatorial election.

32 This Act shall take effect upon its approval by a
33 majority of the legal voters of the Town of Gray vot-
34 ing at that election, provided that, in no event, may
35 this Act take effect sooner than 90 days following
36 the adjournment of the First Regular Session of the
37 112th Legislature.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to extend the boundaries of the Gray Water District to encompass the entire Town of Gray.

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
