10 11 12	Amend the bill by striking out all of the emergency preamble and inserting in its place the following:
13 14 15	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
16 17 18	Whereas, the State has a high rate of occupational injury and disability and in consequence thereof has high workers' compensation costs; and
19 20 21 22 23 24	Whereas, it is in the public interest to immediately act to reduce injuries and deaths and their human and financial cost and to restore injured workers to suitable employment and to provide for appropriate incentives for workplace safety and thus reduce the cost of workers' compensation; and
25 26 27 28 29	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
31	STATEMENT OF FACT
32 33 34	The fundamental facts recited in the emergency preamble are untrue. The emergency preamble alleges that workers' compensation costs are rising in Maine

The emergency preamble implies that workers' compensation costs are higher in Maine than in other New England states which is again untrue. Maine workers' compensation costs are average for the New England states. Lastly, the emergency preamble alleges that the Maine economy has been hurt and job creation affected whereas, in fact, 1984 was a banner year for the Maine economy; the best peacetime ever in terms of job creation, income increases and low unemployment rate. The rate of increase in wages in Maine in the last 4 years has exceeded the national average and is the highest in New England.
14 15 16	It is important that the emergency preamble be accurate and it is crucial that it not be demonstrably untrue.
