COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "?" to H.P. 1131, L.D.
 1638, Bill, "AN ACT Concerning Transitional Services
 for Handicapped Persons Beyond School Age."

10 Amend the bill by striking out everything after 11 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the 12 following:

13 'Sec. 1. Submission of final report. The Legislature accepts the publication of the interim report 14 15 of the Select Committee to Address Training and Employment Opportunities for Handicapped Persons Beyond 16 17 School Age. The interim report demonstrates a real 18 to continue the effort to bring a final report need to the Legislature. To that end, the select commit-19 20 tee shall continue its efforts and submit a final re-21 port with any necessary legislation to the Governor 22 and to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations 23 and Financial Affairs; the Joint Standing Committee 24 on Education; and the Joint Standing Committee on Hu-25 man Resources no later than January 1, 1986.

26 Based on the interim report, the Legislature recognizes a need to provide relief to handicapped young 27 28 persons who will be leaving school this year. In or-29 der to provide such relief the Bureau of Mental Retardation, Department of Mental Health and Mental Re-30 31 tardation, shall, upon the effective date of this 32 Act, hire 5 Client Services Coordinators in order to 33 assist these young people and their families with the 34 transition from school. The Bureau of Mental Retar-35 dation shall establish 6 pilot centers distributed 36 throughout the state. Each pilot center shall pro-37 vide training and employment opportunities for handi-38 capped persons who are beyond school age. Each pilot 39 center shall be expected to provide services to 30 40 individuals per year. The Client Services Coordina-

tors shall be located in 5 of the areas covered by the centers. The Bureau of Mental Retardation shall report to the Select Committee no later than December 1, 1985. The report shall include the projected numbers of handicapped persons who will be trained and employed by the centers.

7 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are 8 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 9 purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The interim report to the 112th Legislature of 3 the Select Committee to Address Training and Employment Opportunities for Handicapped Persons Beyond School Age documents the beginning of an effort which 4 5 6 should get a full hearing before the Legislature. To 7 that end, this amendment directs the select committee 8 prepare a final report, with any necessary legisto g lation, by January 1, 1986.

10 The Bureau of Mental Retardation is receiving 11 referrals of school age retarded persons at the rate of 300 per year. Special education directors, ac-12 cording to the interim report, state that mentally retarded students require the broadest range of ser-13 14 15 vices in order to make the transition from school to 16 employment. In order to provide those services, this 17 amendment provides for: 5 case managers who will link 18 these young handicapped persons with existing ser-19 vices with each case manager serving 50 clients and 20 their families; the establishment of 6 pilot centers 21 which are to provide training; and employment oppor-22 tunities for handicapped youth leaving school. Thir-23 ty individuals are to be served by each of the 6 cen-24 ters.
