STATE OF MAINE
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
AN ACT to Provide for Cost Sharing for Maintenance of Railroad Grade and
Highway Bridge Crossings and the
Allocation and Appropriation of Funds
for Transportation Purposes.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 23 MRSA §2930 is enacted to read:
§2930. Partial reimbursement of cost
Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
State, by or through the Department of Transporta-
tion, shall reimburse railroad corporations 50% of
the cost, incurred by those corporations, of the
maintenance of public at-grade railroad-highway
crossings, crossing protection devices, including,
automatic signals, gates and crossbucks and grade separation structures carrying the highway over the
railroad.

1	For the purpose of this section, public at-grade
2	crossings shall be those crossings determined by the
3	Commissioner of Transportation to be public cross-
4	ings.

5 An annual contract shall be entered into between 6 the State and each railroad corporation to provide a single one-time payment. The payment shall be based on the 1983 average maintenance cost, adjusted 7 8 biennually by application of the United States Bureau 9 10 of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index, "All Items, All Urban Consumers, " for public at-grade crossings 11 12 multiplied by the number of the crossings on each railroad in the State and the 1983 average mainte-13 14 nance cost, adjusted biennually by application of the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer 15 Price Index, "All Items, All Urban Consumers," for 16 17 eligible grade separation structures multiplied by 18 the number of those structures on each railroad in 19 the State.

20 Each participating railroad corporation shall 21 submit an annual report to the department describing 22 in general terms its public grade crossing and highway over the railroad grade separation structure 23 24 maintenance program indicating the total costs in-25 curred, total quantities of material used and man hours used. The department may review records and 26 27 supporting data of the costs incurred by the railroad 28 corporations.

29 Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are al-30 located from the Highway Fund to carry out the provi-31 sions of section 1.

STATEMENT OF FACT 1 is one of 4 bills submitted for the purpose 2 This 3 of implementing recommendations made by the Gover-4 nor's Committee on Rail Policy. The committee has de-5 veloped several recommendations which have been sub-6 mitted to the Governor and the Legislature and are 7 designed to provide assistance to the rail industry 8 in response to existing and developing rail transpor-9 tation problems. 10 Sections 1 and 2 of this bill implement the com-11 mittee's recommendation that the State assume half of 12 the cost of maintaining highway-at-grade and 13 highway-over-bridges for which the railroads now as-14 sume 100% of the cost. It is the belief of the com-15 mittee that this is a cost that should at least be 16 shared by the State as the benefits of grade cross-17 ings and highway bridges over railroad lines goes 18 primarily to the users of the highway system. Ac-19 cordingly, it is proposed to fund this recommendation from the Highway Fund. 20

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
