15 16 17	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FIVE
18 19 20 21 22	AN ACT Correcting an Error in the Law Relating to Business on Sundays Between Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
23 24 25	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
26 27 28 29	Whereas, the law concerning the operation of businesses on Sunday was amended in 1983 to allow sales on those Sundays falling between Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day; and
30 31 32 33	Whereas, in the last regular session this same provision was amended to conform the State observance of Memorial Day with that of the Federal Government; and
34 35 36	Whereas, this last amendment inadvertently omitted the language enacted in 1983 regarding Sunday sales; and

1 2	Whereas, this bill must take effect prior to the first Sunday following Thanksgiving; and
3 4 5 6 7 8	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
9 10	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
11 12	17 MRSA §3204, first ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1985, c. 114, §3, is amended to read:
13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23	No person, firm or corporation may, on the Lord's Day except between the hours of noon and 5:00 p.m. on those Sundays falling between Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day; Memorial Day, the last Monday in May, but if the Federal Government designates May 30th as the date for observance of Memorial Day, the 30th of May; July 4th; Labor Day, the first Monday of September; Veterans' Day, November 11th; Christmas Day and Thanksgiving Day as proclaimed by the Governor, keep open a place of business to the public, except for works of necessity, emergency or charity.
24 25 26	Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
27	STATEMENT OF FACT
28 29 30 31	The purpose of this bill is to correct an inadvertent error which deleted the language which allows businesses to remain open on Sundays between Thanksgiving and Christmas.
