- 2. Registered substance abuse counselor. "Registered substance abuse counselor" means a registered substance abuse counselor who establishes, to the satisfaction of the commissioner, that he is engaged in substance abuse training or education.
 - 3. Substance abuse training materials. "Substance abuse training materials" means any scheduled drug, drug paraphernalia or hypodermic apparatus as defined in Title 17-A, chapter 45.
- 10 §2202. Substance abuse training materials; permit

Notwithstanding Title 17-A, chapter 45, the Com-missioner of Public Safety may, upon application, is-sue a permit to any registered substance abuse counselor or law enforcement officer, subject to this chapter, allowing the applicant to possess substance abuse training materials to be used by the applicant in the course of providing substance abuse training and education.

§2203. Rules

The commissioner shall promulgate rules, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, to carry out this chapter. These rules shall, at a minimum, provide for:

- 1. Permit criteria. Criteria for the issuance, denial, renewal, reissuance or revocation of permits under this chapter;
- 2. Permit duration. The length of time for which a permit is valid under this chapter;
- 3. Periodic evaluations. Periodic evaluations and examinations of persons holding permits under this chapter and the substance abuse training materials held by those persons;
 - 4. Types and amounts of materials. The types and amounts of substance abuse training materials for which a permit may be issued under this chapter; and
 - 5. Background investigation. Procedures for investigation of an applicant's background and history
