	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	28 MRSA §801-C, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 246, §8, is amended to read:
	4. Approval of municipal officers. Approval by the municipal officers, or their designee, of the municipality in which the catered function or event is to be held may be granted without public notice; and

STATEMENT OF FACT

Under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 28, section 801-C, qualified catering services already holding state liquor licenses must again be licensed on a case-by-case basis by the municipal officers to have so-called off-premises functions. This works a hardship for the catering services which frequently do not get sufficient notice from their prospective customers to permit the matter to be considered by the local municipal officers. This bill permits the municipal officers to delegate this case-by-case approval to another municipal official, probably the town clerk.

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
