20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 12 MRSA §7055, as amended by PL 1985, c. 304, §2,
23 is further amended to read:

24 §7055. Officials with full powers of game wardens

25 Sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, police officers, con-
26 stables, marine patrol officers, wardens of the
27 Penobscot Indian Nation ~~within the Penobscot Indian~~
28 ~~Territory~~, as defined by Title 30, section 6205, sub-
29 ~~section 2~~, and law enforcement personnel employed by
30 the United States Department of the Interior shall
31 have the powers of game wardens.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The purpose of this bill is to give wardens of
3 the Penobscot Indian Nation the same authority as
4 state wardens throughout the State. Penobscot Indian
5 Nation wardens observe many violations while enroute
6 to Penobscot Nation Trust Territory and do not have
7 the power to enforce state laws.
