11 12	Amend the bill by inserting after the title and before the enacting clause the following:
13 14 15	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
16 17 18 19	Whereas, it is important that the people of the State have available to them the most expeditious process possible for receiving protection from abuse orders from the courts; and
20 21 22 23 24	Whereas, receipt of these orders will be expedited if the Superior Court may issue an emergency temporary protection from abuse order and then transfers the case to the District Court for further proceedings; and
25 26 27 28 29 30	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'
31 32	Further amend the bill by inserting before the Statement of Fact the following:
33 34 35	'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'
