## STATEMENT OF FACT

Under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 19, section 765, subsection 1, a hearing must be held within 21 days of the filing of a complaint. In some counties, this requirement causes a disruption of trials in progress when the action is filed in Superior Court. This bill provides Superior Court Justices with the discretion to transfer the case to the District Court after any temporary order has been authorized in an exparte proceeding.

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
