The statement of the commissioner shall be considered a refusal to register pursuant to section 609.
24 25 26 27 28	The provisions of this paragraph do not apply if the registrant fails to provide any information required to be submitted under this chapter or unreasonably refuses to provide other necessary information requested by the commissioner.

 This bill requires the Maine Board of Pesticides Control to act upon an application for registration of a pesticide that has received approval from the United States Environmental Protection Agency within 90 days from the date the application is properly submitted to the board. At present, there is no time limit for the board to act. This has resulted in unreasonable delays in registering pesticides which have already been approved for use by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

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
