2 Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §601, as enacted by PL 1983, 3 c. 460, §3, is amended to read:

## 4 §601. Home established; purpose

As previously established, there shall be a home 5 6 for veterans in Maine known as the "Maine Veterans! Home"- There shall be 3 public homes for veterans in Maine, known collectively as the "Maine Veterans' 7 Maine, 8 9 In addition to the presently existing 120-bed Home". 10 Maine Veterans' Home located in Augusta, the Legislature declares that there is a need for a 120-bed vet-11 12 erans' nursing home located in southern Maine and a 13 nursing home of size and scope to meet the needs of 14 veterans in Aroostook County. The planning and development of these 2 additional homes are entrusted 15 to the Board of Trustees of the Maine Veterans' Home. The primary purpose of the home shall be to provide 16 17 18 support and care for honorably discharged veterans 19 who served in the United States Armed Forces during 20 wartime, including the Korean Conflict and the Viet 21 Nam War.

22 Sec. 3. 37-B MRSA §602, sub-§6, as enacted by PL
23 1983 c. 460 §3, is amended to read:

24 Borrow funds. Borrow funds, not in excess of 6. 25 \$170007000 in the aggregate, make and issue bonds and 26 negotiate notes and other evidences of indebtedness 27 or obligations of the veterans' home for prudent and reasonable capital, operational and maintenance pur-28 29 poses. The home may secure payments of all or part 30 of the obligations by pledge of part of the revenues 31 or assets of the home which are available for pledge 32 and which may be lawfully pledged or by mortgage of part, or all, of any property owned by the home. The 33 34 home may do all lawful things necessary and inciden-35 tal to those powers. The home may borrow money from 36 the Federal Government and its agencies, from state 37 agencies and from any other source. The home may 38 borrow money from the State subject to approval by 39 the Treasurer of State and the Governor. Bonds, 40 notes and other evidences of indebtedness issued under this subsection shall not be deemed to constitute 41

1 debts of the State, nor a pledge of the credit of the 2 State, but shall be payable solely from the funds of 3 the home; and

## STATEMENT OF FACT

5 The purpose of this bill is to authorize the es-6 tablishment of 2 additional nursing homes for veter-7 ans in the northern and southern sections of Maine in 8 order to meet the demands of the aging veteran popu-9 lation in need of such care. The ceiling on borrow-10 ing authority is removed in order to accomplish this 11 purpose.

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
