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All such registrations shall expire on December 31st of any one year or in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act as to license expiration, Title 5, section 10002, whichever is later.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Current law requires that manufacturers and other registrants of pesticides must register each individual product with the State prior to its use within the State. Each registrant must provide a current label that provides instruction for use and fulfill any requirements requested by the Board of Pesticides Control and provide a registration fee. Proposed legislation amends the registration fee from \$60 to \$100 per annum per product. The current fee structure is inadequate for the Board of Pesticides Control to determine if each product is being used according to the label instructions.

This bill also removes the \$10 surcharge earmarked for medical research. This surcharge, tied to retail sales of pesticides, was confusing and unenforceable. Most registrants sell pesticides both directly to retailers as well as New England distributers. The registrant and the Board of Pesticides Control have no means of verifying the total quantities of sales.

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
