	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	36 MRSA §6108, first ¶, as amended by PL 1981, c. 698, §189, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
	No claim otherwise allowable may be granted to claimants of single member households with household income in excess of \$7,300 in calendar year 1985 and as adjusted annually thereafter. No claim otherwise allowable may be granted to claimants of households of 2 or more members with income in excess of \$8,800 in calendar year 1985 and as adjusted annually thereafter.

1 STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to increase the income eligibility levels for the elderly tax and rent refund program to account for inflation between 1982 and 1985 in order to permit persons who were dropped from the program because their income kept pace with inflation to again be eligible.

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
