STATE OF MAINE
IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
AN ACT to Revise the Maine Apiary Laws.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
7 MRSA Pt. 6, as amended, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
PART 6
HONEYBEE INDUSTRY
CHAPTER 521
LICENSING REQUIREMENTS
§2701. Licensing
All persons owning honeybees within the State shall annually notify the commissioner of the keeping of bees and the location of the bees and shall for- ward to the commissioner for deposit with the Trea-

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1	surer of State an annual license fee not to exceed
2	50¢ per colony for all bees kept on June 15th of each
3	year. Fees shall be established by rule in accordance
4	with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5,
5	chapter 375. No license fee returned may be less than
6	\$2 per beekeeper. License fees shall accrue to the
7	General Fund.
8	Between 14 and 30 days prior to June 15th annual-
9	ly, the commissioner shall cause notice of the annual
10	notification and license fee requirement to be pub-
11	lished at least twice in the state newspaper and in
12	other newspapers or journals of general circulation
13	adequate to provide reasonable notice throughout the
14	State.
15	CHAPTER 523
16	IMPORTATION REQUIREMENTS
17	§2751. Import permits
18	Honeybees or used honeybee equipment shipped or
19	moved from any other state or country into this State
20	must be accompanied by a permit issued by the Depart-
21	ment of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources. The
22	department shall issue a permit for the importation
23	of honeybees or used honeybee equipment when the ap-
24	plicant submits a completed application form, a cer-
25	tified health certificate and the registration fee.
26	The application, certificate of inspection and regis-
27	tration fee must be received by the department and
28	the permit issued prior to movement of honeybees or
29	equipment into the State.
30	§2752. Application forms
31	Application forms shall be supplied by the de-
32	partment upon request and the following information
33	must be supplied by the applicant:
34	1. Number of hives or boxes. The number of hives
35	or the number of boxes containing comb, or both, to
36	be moved;
37	2. Place of orgin. The locality; city or cities,
38	if any; the county or counties; and the state of ori-
39	gin of the hives or boxes of comb;

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1	3. Destination. The property, locality and coun-
2	ty in which the hives or boxes of comb will be
∠ 3	ty in which the hives or boxes of comb will be placed;
4	4. Date of entry. The proposed date of entry in-
5	to the State;
6	5. Purpose. Facts pertaining to the purpose for
7	which the honeybees and boxes of comb, or both, are
8	to be moved, including evidence establishing the ex-
9	istence of a contractor agreement for pollination
10	services; and
11	6. Bees leased or brokered for pollination pur-
12	poses. In the event that honeybees are leased or
13	brokered to another beekeeper for pollination pur-
14	poses:
15 16	A. The name and address of the individual who leased the bees to the pollinator; and
17 18	B. A list of all brands or other evidence of identity of brokered bees.
19	§2753. Certificates of inspection
20	No honeybees or used honeybee equipment may be
21	shipped into the State without a health certificate
22	signed by a legally authorized inspector at the point
23	of shipment indicating that they are free from regu-
24	lated contagious or infectious diseases and parasites
25	based on actual inspection made within 30 days of the
26	date of the shipment. These certificates must also
27	indicate the destination of the bees or equipment
28	within the State.
29	§2754. Registration fees
30	A registration fee not to exceed 50¢ per colony
31	for all bees to be shipped or moved into the State
32	shall be forwarded to the commissioner for deposit
33	with the Treasurer of State. Fees shall be estab-
34	lished by rule in accordance with the Maine Adminis-
35	trative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375. The fees
36	shall accrue to the General Fund.

3	§2771. Disease and parasites of honeybees
4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 4 15 6 7 8 9 10 11 22 12 23 4 5 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 22 2	The commissioner shall adopt rules to designate the diseases and parasites to be regulated in accord- ance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Ti- tle 5, chapter 375. All honeybees infected with the disease known as American Foulbrood, European Foul- brood or other regulated honeybee diseases and parasites, together with the equipment contaminated by any such disease or parasite, are declared to be a danger to spreading these diseases and parasites. All honeybees and equipment which are suspected by the commissioner to be infected or infected with a regu- lated disease or parasite shall be quarantined in a location stipulated by the commissioner. The presence of a regulated disease or parasite shall be confirmed using a suitable method and qualified agency autho- rized by the commissioner. Upon confirmation, the beekeeper shall be notified by a state bee inspector and allowed 7 days to eliminate the disease in a man- ner prescribed by the commissioner. If no corrective action is taken within 7 days, the infected or in- fested colonies shall be abated by a bee inspector in a manner prescribed by rule in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter
27 28	<u>375.</u> §2772. Possession
29 30 31 32 33 34 35	It is unlawful for any person to knowingly own or possess honeybees having any contagious or infectious disease or parasite or bee equipment and appliances contaminated by any such disease or parasite. It is unlawful to sell, barter or give away bees, equipment or appliances from any apiary without a certificate of inspection from a qualified bee inspector.

37	INSPECTION
38	§2801. Inspection duties

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1	The State Apiarist and part-time bee inspectors
2	employed by the commissioner shall make such inspec-
3	tions of the apiaries or hive locations throughout
4	the State as the commissioner deems necessary to de-
5	termine the presence of regulated honeybee diseases
6	or parasites of an infectious or contagious nature.
7	§2802. Part-time bee inspectors
8	The commissioner may employ one or more persons
9	qualified by experience and knowledge in beekeeping
10	and detection of bee diseases as part-time inspectors
11	of apiaries, to assist the State Apiarist.
12	§2803. Employment restrictions
13	The State Apiarist may not own more than 50 colo-
14	nies of honeybees. Any part-time bee inspector may
15	not own more than 100 colonies of honeybees.
16	§2804. Salary
17	Qualified part-time bee inspectors shall be em-
18	ployed on a per diem basis and shall receive neces-
19	sary traveling expenses while actually engaged in the
20	performance of their duties. A part-time bee inspec-
21	tor shall serve during the pleasure of the commis-
22	sioner.
23	§2805. Access to apiaries
24	Inspectors may enter, at all reasonable times,
25	upon the premises of any keeper of bees or hive loca-
26	tions and make the examination of such bees, equip-
27	ment and appliances found on the premises as he may
28	deem necessary to determine the presence of conta-
29	gious or infectious diseases or parasites.
30	§2806. Inspection certificates
31	Any inspector shall, within 30 days after exami-
32	nation, issue certificates that honeybee equipment
33	and appliances are apparently free from regulated
34	disease and parasites or contamination, if so found.
35	The certificates shall be filed as follow: One copy
36	to the commissioner; one copy to the owner; and one
37	copy to the inspector's files.
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1	CHAPTER 529
2	PROTECTION FROM DAMAGE
3	§2851. Distrubing honeybees on another's land
4 5 7 8 9 10	No person may enter upon the land of another for the purpose of capturing, destroying or interfering with a colony or swarm of honeybees or removing hon- ey, except by the consent of the owner of the land. Violation of any of this section is civil violation for which a forfeiture of not less than \$50 nor more than \$100 shall be adjudged for each violation.
11	§2852. Damage to hives from bears
12 13 14 15	Any licensed beekeeper may obtain a permit from the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife or his agents to protect hives from damage by bears. CHAPTER 531
16	RULES AND VIOLATIONS
17	§2871. Rules
18 19 20	The commissioner shall adopt rules to enforce this Part in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375.
21	§2872. Violations
22 23 24 25	A violation of chapter 521, 523 or 527 is a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not less than \$1 nor more than \$50 shall be adjudged for each colony in violation of these chapters.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill repeals and replaces the current Maine 3 apiary laws and reorganizes the laws. It strengthens  $\mathbf{4}$ the Maine apiary laws to prevent the introduction and spread of honeybee diseases and parasites. It ad-5 6 dresses both current and potential health problems. 7 The bill clarifies the health requirements for bees entering the State to pollinate blueberry and apple 8 9 crops. It defines stricter notification requirements for importing bees into the State. The bill imposes 10 11 stricter penalties for violations.

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
