An investigation is con-cluded upon issuance of a letter of dismissal or upon listing of the complaint on a published commission 27 28 29 meeting agenda, whichever first occurs. Notwith-standing any other provision of this section, the 30 31 32 complaint and evidence collected during the investi-33 gation of the complaint may be used as evidence in 34 any subsequent proceeding, civil or criminal. Further amend the bill in section 2, subsection 35

36 3, in the 4th and 5th lines from the end (page 3, 37 lines 8 and 9 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined 38 words "filed by the commission or a party alleging a 39 breach of agreement" and inserting in their place the

1 following: 'alleging a breach of agreement filed by 2 the commission or a party' 3 STATEMENT OF FACT The purpose of this amendment is to define when investigations of complaints under the Maine Human 4 5 Rights Act are concluded. Under the bill, the con-6 clusion of an investigation is the point at which the 7 8 complaint and evidence collected during the investigation become public records. The amendment defines 9 10 the conclusion of an investigation as the issuance of 11 a dismissal letter or the publication of a commission 12 meeting agenda listing the complaint.
