## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit bond revenue originally earmarked for use in the Town Way Bridge Program to be used instead in the new Local Bridge Improvement Program enacted by the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The Town Way Bridge Improvement Program was repealed and replaced by the Local Bridge Improvement Program.

The new Local Bridge Improvement Program will shift more of the responsibility for the capital improvement of local bridges to the State. Local bridges consist of those bridges on the town way and state aid systems. Historically, these bridges have been improved through a state-local partnership. Under this program, capital improvement priorities are established by a formula that considers the condition of the structure the traffic using the structure and the protection of the public's investment.

The Department of Transportation promised to submit an initial funding proposal for consideration by the Second Regular Session of the 112th Legislature. The department feels that, by combining the unspent bond revenue with other available state funds and with federal bridge funds, it will be able to effect a viable initial program.

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
