	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
	AN ACT to Allow Administrative Agencies to Continue to Adopt Emergency Rules Where Necessary.
	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	5 MRSA §8053-A, first ¶, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 270, is amended to read:
	At least 20 days prior to the adoption of any rule, or within 10 days following the adoption of an emergency rule, the agency shall provide copies of the rule to the Begislative Administrative Director of the Begislature Executive Director of the Legisla- tive Council. The Begislative Administrative Director Executive Director of the Legislative Council, or his designee, shall refer the rule to the appropriate joint standing committee or committees of the Legis- lature for review.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 The 112th Legislature enacted a requirement that 3 agencies provide copies of proposed rules to the Legislature at least 20 days prior to their adoption. 4 5 This statute inadvertently applied to emergency rules 6 adopted by administrative agencies where the public 7 health, safety or general welfare might require imme-8 diate action. This bill allows emergency rules to continue to be adopted when necessary, with provision 9 for subsequent notification to the Legislature. This 10 11 original requirement of prior notification to the 12 Legislature continues to apply to all rules except 13 where there is an emergency need for immediate ac-14 tion.

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
