17 AN ACT Concerning Fees Imposed on the
18 Generation of Hazardous Waste.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1319-I, sub-§3-A is enacted to
23 read:

24 3-A. Fee on certain hazardous material. Any
25 person who accepts the following materials in a solid,
26 semi-solid or liquid state and in a quantity ex-
27 ceeding 10,000 pounds per shipment shall pay a fee of
28 0.1¢ a pound:

29 A. Ammonia;

30 B. Chlorine;

31 C. Hydrochloric acid;

32 D. Sodium hydroxide, caustic soda; and

1 E. Sulfuric acid.

2 **Sec. 2. 38** MRSA §1319-I, sub-§8, as enacted by
3 PL 1981, c. 478, §7, is repealed.

4 STATEMENT OF FACT

5 This bill establishes a new fee to be levied upon
6 recipients of certain hazardous materials. The fees
7 will be deposited in the Maine Hazardous Waste Fund.
8 This bill also repeals the annual ceiling on fees im-
9 posed on generators of hazardous waste.

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
