17 AN ACT to Clarify Sales of Surplus Vehicles
18 at State Auction.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 10 MRS.A §1471, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1975, c.
23 770, §57, is amended to read:

24 2. Dealer. "Dealer" means and includes a natural
25 person, firm, corporation, partnership and any other
26 legal entity that is engaged in the business of sell-
27 ing, offering for sale, or negotiating the sale of
28 used motor vehicles, except auctioneers licensed by
29 the Secretary of State and includes the officers,
30 agents and employees thereof. "Dealer" does not in-
31 clude departments or agencies of the State when sell-
32 ing, offering for sale or negotiating the sale of
33 used state-owned motor vehicles.

STATEMENT OF FACT

2 This bill clarifies present law by exempting the
3 State from the Used Car Information Act. This allows
4 the Department of Finance and Administration to con-
5 tinue selling state-owned surplus vehicles to the
6 public at auction. These auctions not only add sub-
7 stantial amounts to the General Fund but also allow
8 the public an opportunity to bid on items their tax
9 dollars originally purchased.
