	STATE	OF MAINE		<u></u>
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1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 2 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 3 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-5 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 6 therefore,

7 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 8 follows:

9 12 MRSA §683, as amended by PL 1985 c. 345, is 10 further amended to read:

11 <u>§683. Creation of Maine Land Use Regulation Commis-</u> 12 <u>sion</u>

13 The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, as established by Title 5, section 12004, subsection 5, to 14 15 carry out the purposes stated in section 681, is cre-16 ated within the Department of Conservation, and in chapter called the "commission." The commission 17 this is charged with implementing this chapter in all 18 of 19 the unorganized and deorganized areas of the State. 20 The commission shall consist of 7 public members, 21 none of whom shall be state employees, who shall be 22 appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the 23 Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources and to 24 confirmation by the Legislature, for staggered 4-year terms. Among the public members, there shall be 4 who shall be knowledgeable in at least one of each of 25 26 27 the following areas: Commerce and industry; fisheries 28 and wildlife; forestry; and conservation. Of the po-29 tential appointees to the commission, the Governor 30 shall give consideration to persons residing in or 31 near the unorganized areas of the State and at least 32 one member shall be a resident of a town or planta-33 tion within the commission's jurisdiction the area 34 being served by the commission.

Of the initial appointees, 2 shall be appointed for one-year terms, 2 shall be appointed for 2-year terms and 2 shall be appointed for 3-year terms. Thereafter, appointees shall be appointed to serve 4-year terms. One of the members shall be elected annually by the members as chairman. 1 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 2 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when ap-3 proved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

5 The Maine Land Use Regulation Commission serves 416 unorganized townships, 46 towns and plantations 6 and several hundred coastal islands. Currently, the 7 law requires that one member of the commission be 8 from one of 46 towns or plantations. This bill 9 extends equal representation to the other residents of 10 areas within the commission's jurisdiction by requir-11 ing that one member of the commission be a resident 12 of any area within the entire Land Use Regulation 13 14Commission jurisdiction.

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
