STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide persons working as mediators with the Court Mediation Service with immunity from civil liability for their good faith acts within the scope of their duties as mediators. Court mediators are not state employees and therefore do not enjoy the protection from liability for discretionary acts extended to state employees under the Maine Tort Claims Act. This bill provides persons working as mediators with an immunity similar to that provided for state employees.

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
