14 MRSA §166-A is enacted to read:

§166-A. Immunity for providers of shelter

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a bona fide charitable or not-for-profit organization or any employee or volunteer of that organization who, without charge, in good faith provides shelter to any person who would otherwise be without shelter is immune from civil liability arising from an injury or death occurring in or due to the condition of the shelter or on any connected premises, unless the injury or death is a direct result of the gross negligence, recklessness or intentional misconduct of the organization.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill states that organizations which provide shelter to the homeless will be immune from civil liability for injury or death on the property.

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
