14 15 16	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-SIX
17 18 19 20	AN ACT to Include Drugs for Treating Arthritis in the Elderly Low Cost Drug Program.
21 22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
23 24 25	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §254, first ¶, as amended by PL 1983, c. 290, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
26 27 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36	The Department of Human Services may conduct a program to provide low cost prescription and nonprescription drugs, medication and medical sup- plies to disadvantaged, elderly individuals. In any year in which this program is conducted, it shall in- clude any prescription drugs used for the treatment of arthritis. To fund the addition of drugs for this ailment, the amount that a recipient pays toward the cost of any covered purchase shall be raised \$1 for the entire program. If, after any results of the ar- thritis program appear to be reflected in the expend-

1 itures for the total program, it is projected that the funding for the total program will be inadequate 2 3 for the remainder of the fiscal year, that part of 4 the program dealing with arthritis shall be discon-5 tinued for the remainder of the fiscal year. The de-6 partment shall keep cost and utilization records nec-7 essary to evaluate the arthritis program and report 8 on this arthritis program to the Legislature by Janu-9 ary, 1988.

10 The commissioner is required to provide for suf-11 ficient personnel to ensure efficient administration of the program. The extent and the magnitude of this 12 13 program shall be determined by the Commissioner of Human Services and shall be determined on the basis 14 15 of the calculated need of the recipient population 16 and the available funds. The department may not spend more on the conduct of this program than is 17 available either through appropriations from the Gen-18 19 eral Fund, dedicated revenue, federal or other grants 20 and other established and committed funding sources. 21 The commissioner may accept for the purposes of carrying out this program federal funds appropriated un-22 23 der any federal law relating to the furnishing of 24 free or low cost drugs to disadvantaged, elderly individuals and take such action as is necessary for 25 the purposes of carrying out that federal law and ac-26 cept from any other agency of government, individual, group or corporation such funds as may be available 27 28 29 to carry out this chapter.

30 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are 31 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the 32 purposes of this Act.
