22 23 24	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legis- lature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
25 26 27 28	Whereas, the University of Maine system is currently in the midst of a long-range planning process which is increasingly subject to legislative and public interest; and

Whereas, there is need for an open and representative process for the selection of the new chancellor; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

- Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-A, as enacted by P&SL 1967, c. 229, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 15 Sec. 4-A. Administration.

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- 1. Chancellor; nomination; confirmation; evaluation; term. A chancellor of the university shall be chosen as follows.
 - A. The chancellor shall be nominated by a specially created nominating committee consisting of 3 members of the board of trustees appointed by the president of the board and representing the various geographical regions of the State; 3 university faculty members; 3 university students; one professional employee of the university representing University of Maine Professional Staff Association; one classified employee of the university representing Associated Faculties of the University of Maine selected by the board; alumni of the university selected by the alumni office of the university; and one public member selected by the board. The committee shall elect a chairman from among its members. One of the faculty members and one of the student members shall be from the University of Maine at Orono; and one of the faculty members and one of the student members shall be from the University of Southern Maine. The other faculty and student members shall represent other campuses within the university system.

The president's office at each campus shall submit to the board a list containing the name of one candidate for each of the faculty, student, professional employee and classified employee positions on the nominating committee. The board shall select members for those positions from the lists.

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- B. Following selection of a nominee for chancellor, the nominating committee shall immediately notify the board of trustees. The board shall send to both the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a written notice of the name of the nominee. Confirmation of the nominee shall be as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 151. The vote of the Senate shall be taken not later than 45 days from the date of the board's written notice of the nomination to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The board of trustees may withdraw a nomination upon the recommendation of the nominating committee at anytime prior to the Senate vote by sending a written notice of withdrawal to the President of the Senate.
- C. The board of trustees shall cause a performance evaluation of the chancellor to be conducted each year following his appointment. That evaluation shall be performed by an evaluation committee consisting of 7 members appointed by the board.

The evaluation committee shall consist of one member from each of the following groups: The board of trustees; university faculty; university students; professional employees of the university; classified employees of the university, university alumni; and the public. The committee shall elect a chairman from among its members. The membership of the committee shall represent the various geographical regions of the State; and no more than one member may represent a single campus within the University of Maine system. In carrying out its evaluation, the committee shall provide opportunity for public comment. The evaluation committee shall submit copies of

its annual performance evaluation to the board of trustees and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education. The recommendations of the evaluation committee shall be nonbinding.

- D. Upon confirmation, the chancellor shall serve a 5-year term and may serve until a successor is appointed and qualified. The chancellor may be reappointed to additional 5-year terms by the board of trustees without the nomination and confirmation procedures described in this section. In making a reappointment, the board shall consider each of the previous annual performance evaluations of the chancellor provided under this section.
- 2. Campus heads. The chancellor shall nominate and the board of trustees shall appoint the persons to head the various campuses and shall give those persons titles which are deemed appropriate. The head of a campus may not serve concurrently as chancellor or as a member of the board of trustees.
- 3. Administrative council. An administrative council composed of the heads of each institution shall be formed.
- 4. The board of trustees shall appoint such advisory committees on behalf of the various campuses and such other advisory committees as may appear desirable.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

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The purpose of this bill is to amend the way the Chancellor of the University of Maine is appointed, reappointed and evaluated. The new method provides for a more open and representative tion process and for legislative review and confirmation of the chancellor similar to the method for othhigh-level administrative positions in State Gov-The bill also provides for an annual evaluernment. ation of the chancellor's performance, submission an annual performance evaluation report, and issuance nonbinding recommendations to the board of trustees and the Legislature. Finally, the bill provides for fixed 5-year term for the chancellor, rather a than serving at the pleasure of the board. pointment by the board of trustees for additional terms is authorized and the reappointment process must include consideration of all previous perform-This bill is designed to clarify ance evaluations. and improve the relationship between the University of Maine system and the Legislature and, in so doing, provide greater accountability between the University of Maine system, the Legislature and the people of Maine.

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
