18 AN ACT to Allow Minors to Enter Class A
19 Liquor Lounges.

20 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as
21 follows:

22 28 MRSA §2, sub-§8, ¶K-1, as enacted by PL 1985,
23 c. 252, §2, is amended to read:

24 K-1. "Class A lounge" means a reputable place
25 operated by responsible persons of good reputa-
26 tion, where food and liquor are sold at tables,
27 booths and counters. At least 10% of the total
28 volume of business shall be the sale of food.
29 Minors Persons under 18 years of age are not per-
30 mitted to remain on the premises unless accompa-
31 nied by a parent, legal guardian or custodian as
32 defined in Title 22, section 4002. All Class A
33 lounges shall be licensed by the Department of
34 Human Services.
