20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

23	SUBCHAPTER VIII
24	STOCKING OF FISH
25	§7781. Definitions
26 27 28	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
29 30 31	1. Body of water. "Body of water" means the navigable waters of the State, the great ponds, their tributaries and distributaries.

- 2. Commissioner. "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.
  - 3. Nonnative species. "Nonnative species" means a species which has not been in the 10 years prior to the proposed stocking, except by reason of prior stocking, common or predominant in the relevant body of water, its tributaries, its distributaries or any other body of water to which the species can reasonably be expected to gain access from the body of water proposed to be stocked.
  - 4. Stocked or stocking. "Stocked or stocking" refers to the process of introduction by human intervention of a species into a body of water not generally inhabited by that species.

## §7782. Stocking prohibited

No agency or officer of the State may stock or cause to be stocked any body of water located in the State with any nonnative species unless the commissioner, after the hearing provided for in this subchapter, first makes the finding required by this subchapter.

## §7783. Hearings and findings

1. Hearing. At least 90 days prior to any stocking regulated by this subchapter, the commis-sioner shall conduct a hearing at a convenient location situated not more than 20 miles from the site of the proposed stocking, and shall give at least 20 days' prior written notice of the hearing to the municipal officers of any municipality in which the body of water is located and to the Department of Environmental Protection. The commissioner shall publish a notice of the hearing at least 20 days prior to the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in any county in which the body of water into which the species are to be directly introduced is located. The commissioner shall also give notice of the hearing to any campowners', sportsmen's, environmental or other organization having a specific interest in the body of water. At the hearing, the commissioner shall hear evidence relating to the probable effects of the stocking upon:

1 A. Predominant or common existing species of the 2 body of water; 3 B. Water quality of the body of water; 4 C. Recreational and other existing uses of the 5 body of water; and 6 D. Existing recreational and commercial fisher-7 ies. 8 2. Findings. Within 30 days after the date of completion of the hearing, the commissioner shall is-9 sue his findings as to the probable effects set out 10 11 in subsection 1. The commissioner shall not permit 12 the stocking unless he finds that the proposed stock-13 ing will not: A. Adversely affect the predominant or common 14 15 existing species of the body of water; 16 B. Have an adverse impact upon the water quality 17 of the body of water; 18 C. Unreasonably restrict or impede recreational 19 and other existing uses of the body of water; or 20 D. Adversely affect existing recreational or 21 commercial fisheries. 22 §7784. Administrative procedure 23 The commissioner may promulgate, in accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, 24 25 chapter 375, such reasonable procedural rules he

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deems appropriate.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

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5 6 This bill requires the State to provide a hearing and adequate prior notice of the proposed introduction of new species of fish into bodies of water. It provides prior notice to the public and interested parties.

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
