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United States Social Security Act, Titles XVIII and XIX. For the first 2 payment year eyeles, the The commission shall establish the amounts to be credited to the first day of that each payment year cycle as follows:

6 A. For the first payment year cycle, 1% of the 7 sum of:

8 (1) The total budgeted expenses, including 9 capital costs, of all hospitals, for their 10 most recent fiscal year ending prior to July 11 1, 1984, which were submitted to and ap-12 proved by a voluntary budget review organi-13 zation prior to July 1, 1983; and

14 (2) The total actual expenses, including 15 capital costs, which were incurred, in its 16 most recent fiscal year ending prior to July 17 1983, by any hospital which did not se-1, 18 cure approval, prior to July 1, 1983, of its 19 budget for its most recent fiscal year end-20 ing prior to July 1, 1984; and

B. For the 2nd payment year cycle, 1% 2% of the
first payment year financial requirements determined for all hospitals in the State-; and

C. For all payment year cycles subsequent to the
25 2nd payment year cycle, an amount not less than
26 2% of the prior year's financial requirements de27 termined for all hospitals in the State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Pursuant to legislation passed in 1983, Certificate of Need Development Account was created which sets an expenditure limit on hospital projects for new or improved services, equipment and facilities which may be approved by the Department of Human Services.

8 The limit was established by the Legislature for 9 1985 and 1986 at 1% of the prior year's total expenses for Maine hospitals. This 1% limit had 10 no 11 factual or historical basis; its relevance to the assurance of continued or improved access of Maine peo-ple to quality hospital services was unknown. It has 12 13 now become apparent that this limit is too low for 14 15 1986, the 2nd year payment cycle, and subsequent 16 years.

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
